About Jared

Jared Tuccolo was a young healthy boy growing up. He enjoyed playing basketball and baseball, being involved with Boy Scouts, hanging around friends and family, and watching the Red Sox.

In June of 1990, at age 18, Jared was diagnosed with terminal cancer of the brain at Mass General Hospital. Unfortunately, Jared was no stranger to cancer, he lost his mother to cancer when he was two years old. Jared's first concern was when the doctor's told him that his high school basketball career was all but over. Jared turned to his dad and make a commitment, "I will play in the last game of my senior year on February 8, 1991." He took out a calendar and circled February 8th.

After a grueling schedule of chemo and radiation treatments directly to his brain, Jared was named a starter of the basketball team for his only appearance on February 8, 1991. It was an incredible show of inspiration, dedication and determination with the crowd giving him a standing ovation that seemed to last forever.

For the next 9 years, it seemed as if he had beaten cancer. He accomplished his goals of finishing high school and college and pursued his dream of becoming a sports broadcaster on radio and television. He became very popular within the media community and never forgot where he came from, spending hours volunteering for the American Cancer Society raising thousands of dollars.

On October 29, 1999, three days after the very first golf tournament to raise money to help pay for hospital bills, Jared passed away. He was just 27 years old. Since then, The Jared Tuccolo Memorial Golf Tournament was created raising funds for a Scholarship in his name and for TASC, so that his legacy will continue to support others in need.

About Take a Swing at Cancer

What is Take a Swing at Cancer, Inc?

Take a Swing at Cancer (TASC) is a tax-exempt non-profit, IRS designated 501(c)(3) with a mission to help families affected by cancer. We provide grants to assist families with financial burdens not covered by traditional insurance.

Why was Take a Swing at Cancer created?

In 1991, Andy Smyth created the Betty Smyth Softball Classic to be a memorial to his mother who died of cancer and to raise funds for the American Cancer Society. The slogan for the softball tournament was "Take a Swing at Cancer". The event has continued and the creation of TASC has opened the possibility of sponsoring other cancer related fundraisers in the future.

Where the money goes:

TASC is an all-volunteer organization which means nearly 100% of our net proceeds go directly to families, in the form of grants, to assist them in their daily battle with cancer. Via the Jared Tuccolo Memorial, TASC also supports two scholarships in Jared's name.
